One benefit of using your newsletter as a promotional tool is that you can reuse content from other marketing materials, such as press releases, market studies, and reports.

While your main goal of distributing a newsletter might be to sell your product or service, the key to a successful newsletter is making it useful to your readers.

A great way to add useful content to your newsletter is to develop and write your own articles, or include a calendar of upcoming events or a special offer that promotes a new product.

You can also research articles or find "filler" articles by accessing the World Wide Web. You can write about a variety of topics but try to keep your articles short.

Much of the content you put in

your newsletter can also be used for your Web site. Microsoft Publisher offers a simple way to convert your newsletter to a Web publication. So, when you're finished writing your newsletter, convert it to a Web site and post it.

nologies or innovations in your field.

You may also want to note business or economic trends, or make predictions for your customers or clients.

If the newsletter is distributed internally, you might comment upon new procedures or improvements to the business.

Sales figures or earnings will show how your business is growing.

Some newsletters include a column that is updated every issue, for instance, an advice column, a book review, a letter from the president, or an editorial. You can also profile new employees or top customers or

Microsoft Publisher includes thousands of clip art images from which you can choose and import into your newsletter. There are also several tools you can use to draw shapes and symbols.

RANCH BURGERS

These beef burgers stay juicy and delicious on the grill or stove top. Serve on buns with your favorite condiments.

2 pounds lean ground beef

1 (1oz.)pkg ranch dressing mix

1 egg, slightly beaten

3/4 cup crushed saltine crackers

1 onion, chopped

Preheat the grill on high heat. In a bowl, mix ground beef, dressing mix, egg, crushed crackers, and onion. Form into hamburger patties.

Place patties on the grill, cook 5 minutes per side or until well done.

PARKING

Do you have your parking tag displayed so it is visible to the Police Officer when they are patrolling?

Your parking tag must be hanging from the mirror or taped to the lower corner of the windshield.

If it isn't visible to the Officer, your vehicle may be towed.



RENT

Rent is due by the 1st of each month, and must be paid no later than the 5th day of the month. If the 5th falls on a weekend or holiday, you can leave your rent in the drop box next to the front door of the Housing office. Rent received after the 5th day of the month will result in a \$20.00 late fee and a 14-Day Notice. After receiving two 14-Day Notices, a third late payment in a 6-month period will result in a 30-Day Eviction Notice.
