~Go only to well-lit houses and remain on porches.

~Bring candy home before eating it so parents can inspect it.

~Travel in small groups and be accompanied by an adult if they're under age 12.

~Cross streets at the corner and use crosswalks.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS AND TIPS

1. Witch Hazel is a great facial cleanser and toner.
2. Baby shampoo is not only gentle for babies, but can be used by adults for soft shiny hair.
3. Remove onion smell from your hands by first washing them with soap and water. Then while hands are still wet rub them over the faucet spout. "No more smelly hands".
4. Cosmetology schools are great money savers for haircuts and hair coloring. Some even offer nails and pedicures. Students do the work and are supervised by certified teachers, to insure that the work is done correctly.
5. Dampen a cloth with white vinegar then sprinkle cream of tartar on the cloth to clean porcelain.
6. Salt and lemon juice mixed together remove mildew stains.
7. If the tip of your shoe lace becomes frayed, snip off the frayed end. Then paint or dip the end of the shoelace into clear nail polish and let it dry. Good as new.
8. Keep a bottle of Dawn original blue dish detergent on hand, it's a great degreaser as well as a spot remover.
9. To remove the smell of smoke, place bowls of white vinegar around the house to absorb the odor.
10. To clean oil based paint off of your hands, use vegetable oil. The wash hands with warm soapy water.
